Jordan Hill Roman Temple

The remains of a Romano-Celtic temple built during the 4th century with fine views inland and out across Weymouth Bay.



Nothe Fort

Victorian coastal fort with panoramic views, labyrinthine tunnels, guns, displays and lots of fun for all the family.



Old Town Hall

Originally three Tudor cottages but substantially rebuilt in 1744 and 1896. Now a venue for community events.



Tudor House

This early 17th century building in Trinity Street remains a museum and one the UK's best preserved Tudor buildings.



Weymouth Museum

Tells the stories that have led to the creation of present day Weymouth. Located within Brewers Quay near the harbour.



Sandsfoot Castle

Iconic clifftop ruins of a castle built for Henry VIII, set in tranquil Green Flag gardens off the Rodwell Trail.



Castletown D-Day Centre

An exciting family attraction offering an immersive experience telling the story of embarkation from a busy wartime dockyard.



Portland Castle

One of Henry VIII's finest coastal forts, built in the early 1540s to protect against French and Spanish invasion.



Grove Prison Museum

Explains the history of the convict prison and former borstal. Situated in the former Deputy Governor's house built in 1866.



St George's Church

Vast, solitary and inspired by St Paul's Cathedral, St George's is one of the most magnificent 18th century churches in Dorset.



Portland Museum

Founded by the renowned palaeobotanist and birth control pioneer, Dr Marie Stopes, near Church Ope Cove and the 12th century Rufus Castle.




Portland Bill Lighthouse
